
## Make your own... HENOHENOMOHEJI DRAWING!







Heno-heno-mo-he-ji is a way to draw a human face. About 300 years ago, Japanese children started to draw these faces to help them learn how to write! The word breaks down into hiragana alphabet characters:  $he(\land)$ ,  $no(\mathcal{O})$ ,  $he(\land)$ ,  $no(\mathcal{O})$ ,  $mo(\lozenge)$ ,  $he(\land)$ , and  $ji(\lozenge)$ . The first two he are the eyebrows, the two no are the eyes, the mo is a nose, and the last he is the mouth. The outline of the face is made by the character ji, and its two short strokes form the ear or cheek.

Can you see the face that the two naughty boys drew on the wall?

Now try to make your own henohenomoheji face! Be sure to add extras like hair, a hat, or a body. Be creative!
